The cards present target words used in complex sentences that may throw off the meaning for our students who are language learners. I used these cards with my 4th and 5th graders although older students may benefit from there use also.

Words are presented within the context of a short paragraph, two to four sentences in length. A question is then asked targeting a specific word. Words specifically targeted include; neither/nor, either/or, instead, usually, unless, if/then, except, both, after, before, while, when, any, until, during, although. Prepositions such as first, last, between, and middle that indicate a position of individuals are also included.

The down load consists of 12 sheets of cards for a total of 36 card sets. The cards are meant to be printed on cardstock. They are 2 ¾ inch by 3 ¼ inch in size.

A question card is located beside an answer card. Do not cut the center line and the answer card can be folded behind and glued to the question card. This makes a sturdier card and provides the answer when the card is flipped over. You may also want to separate them for some activities. They make good draw cards for student games...


