Snowmen cards are a very useful tool for practicing descriptive sentences in receptive and expressive language. They can be used in the traditional "Matching" and "Go Fish" games. These games are familiar to a variety of age and ability ranges so work well with mixed groups. The students all seem willing to play because it doesn't look like work.

The snowmen have similarities and differences, so students really need to listen carefully or make sure they are being descriptive enough when making questions for their listeners. Saying the snowman has a black hat or stick arms will not give enough information. There are several that fit that description.
